The Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada is the established accrediting agency for graduate theological education. Tracing its origins to 1918 when formal consultations on theological education were begun, the Association now numbers almost 200 institutions reflecting the diversity of the religious communities and university relationships in the two national communities. Its purposes include, within a general mandate for the improvement of theological education, the establishment of standards and the accreditation of institutions, serving as a forum for shared interests, and the consideration of issues among members and between members and related agencies. In the exercise of its standard setting duties, the Association has maintained a list of accredited schools since 1936. The Association also publishes annually a Directory of Theological Schools.

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## INTRODUCTION

This is the fifteenth annual edition of the Fact Book. Each year all of the Association's member schools are required to provide annual reports on forms which are supplied. These reports include information on enrollment, professional staff, and salaries for the current year, 1983-84. They also include graduation statistics, financial reports, and library data from the previous academic year, 1982-83. Per student revenue and per student/per faculty expenditures are based on the fall 1982 "head count" and "full-time equivalency" enrollment and employment, as well as on the audited financial information for the 1982-83 year. These enrollment totals are reported for individual schools of theology in Tables A, B-1, and B-2.

This is the third successive year in which the per student and per faculty revenue/expenditure tables (AA-1 through JJ-2) are supplied on both a "head count" and "full-time equivalency" basis. Tables C-6, D-6, and E-6 in the appendices provide these latter data, with Table B-2 reporting both the "head count" and "FTE enrollments" for individual schools. Tables AA-1 through JJ-1 provide revenue/expenditure data on the "head count" basis, while Tables AA-2 through JJ-2 are parallel, using the "full-time equivalency" information. The differences between the two become increasingly important as schools continue to experience an influx of more part-time students in their various degree programs.

From the beginning of publication a primary purpose of these Fact Books has been to provide annually information on parallel patterns permitting ready comparisons across the years. Where changes have been introduced these have generally been in the form of providing additional information not previously supplied or to

acknowledge changes that have occurred. All data, with the exception of the Native American enrollments, are subjected to computer analysis. Since these latter numbers continue to be quite small, they have been fully summarized in the text, but are not found in the computer generated appendices.

The data received from each school are classified in several ways: size of enrollment, accredited or "other" (i.e., candidate and associate member institutions), university relation, cluster membership, race, denomination, region of location, and highest degree offered for the accredited schools only. These classifications provide the basis for the distributions found in the tables included in the appendices. Table A indicates the classification identifiers for each member school, including both the 1982 and 1983 fall enrollments. Table B-1 reports the changing enrollment patterns for each member school on a quadrennial basis beginning in 1956 or the year of initial Association membership, if later than 1956. Table B-2, included for the third successive year, reports individual school enrollment by separate degree programs for both 1982 and 1983, "head count" and "full-time equivalent."

Certain arbitrary decisions are necessary with regard to these classifications. For example, a seminary is classified as a part of a university only if the larger institution possesses two other professional schools or departments operating at the graduate level. Schools are classified as related to a cluster only if the relationship includes at least two other schools of theology. Denominational groups are sorted and reported publicly--in these Fact Books--only if the denomination maintains at least four institutions which are members of the Association. Because the computer cannot deal with dual denominational status--which some schools hold, each has been classified on the basis of the primary church membership of the student body. Thus, Andover Newton is included in the United Church of

Christ category, rather than American Baptist. Neither Bexley Hall nor the Berkeley Divinity School, both Episcopal seminaries, are included in the Episcopal data because of their relationships with Colgate Rochester and the Yale Divinity School respectively. The Lutheran category is not one denomination, but it combines the data for the American Lutheran Church, Association of Evangelical Lutheran Churches, and Lutheran Church in America schools into a single inclusive category. Prior to the 1982-83 edition the term "Lutheran" applied only to the Lutheran Church in America schools. There are ten institutions included in this new composite Lutheran category. This year for the first time the new denomination, the Presbyterian Church, U.S.A., appears, and the data for prior years have combined the information for the Presbyterian Church in the United States and the United Presbyterian Church. Also, at the request of the school, the data for the Pacific School of Religion have been shifted this year for the first time to the United Church of Christ category, rather than the inter-/nondenominational grouping, as in the past. Tables in the text have been adjusted to reflect this change. However, readers using previous Fact Books must do so with care, since these two subgroupings are no longer precisely parallel in successive volumes.

Since 1980 the Association has had three separate categories of institutional membership: accredited member, candidate for accredited member, and associate member. For the purposes of the Fact Book, the latter two groupings (candidates and associates) have been combined in the "Other" column in the tables presenting size/status data.

As in the past, all salary scales reported in the volume have been edited to preserve confidentiality. Hence any salary data field with less than three salaries being reported indicates the number of persons but does not provide any salary information.

Finally, I as editor have written the text to report and emphasize those data which appear to me to be most important. The goal has been factual presentation and description. No value judgments about size, mode of financing, patterns of expenditure, composition of student body, or other matters are intended. Each reader is invited to make his/her own judgments on the data and their import in reference to his/her own perspectives and commitments in the theological education world.

The Fact Book has been prepared by the ATS staff and is offered to the ATS member schools, as well as the general public, with the hope that it will be useful to those with responsibility for the management of the theological education enterprise in North America. The work has been done with the strong conviction that management decisions are best made when the persons charged with making them have the widest range of and most complete data available to inform their deliberations.

## ENROLLMENT

Theological school enrollments continued to grow during the 1983-84 academic year, as was the situation in preceding years. And the rate of growth appears to be substantially higher than that found in the balance of higher education. The Chronicle of Higher Education estimated that the increase this year was slightly more than one percent. For theological schools it was +4.7%, more than four times greater. And this has been the situation in each of the last several years.

Table 1 provides these enrollment data for each year since 1969, the initial publication year for these Fact Books. In that fourteen year span seminary enrollments have risen from 29,815 persons in 1969 to 55,112 this year, up +84.8%. Some of this growth can be explained by the first column, the increase in the number of Association member schools reporting in the successive autumn periods. However,

the institutional growth rate has been only 14.7%, far below the student enrollment growth of 84.8%. Readers interested in details of this change in institutional membership should consult the 1980-81 Fact Book. Table 1 also indicates that the growth has been chiefly in professional degree programs: i.e., those preparing persons for some leadership role in the churches. The graduate programs, confined chiefly to masters and doctoral degrees primarily for higher education and secondary school teaching, have fluctuated up and down during the years. In 1982 they enrolled almost the same number of persons as 1969 (i.e., 3,865 in 1969 and 3,878 in 1982). Once again in 1983 this rose above 4,000, but it is still well below the graduate students found in the early 1970s. Thus, the enrollment growth is church occupation related, rather than academic career oriented.

Table 2 provides more precise data on enrollment, since the number of institutions reporting in the last two years was not the same. In this table the data have been limited to the theological schools reporting in both years, and the growth was +4.8%, up slightly from the Table 1 figure. One member school terminated its programs during the year and withdrew from membership.

Table 3 continues these comparisons, this time on a five-year basis. During both 1978 and 1983 there were 187 schools reporting both years, and their total enrollments for the two different years are reflected in the table. They constitute a +16.2% growth, or 3.24% per year. In that same time period higher education has been growing at an average rate of between one and two percent, or about one-half of that experienced by theological seminaries. From all three of these tables one must conclude that the apparent growth is not merely apparent. It is real. More and more persons are entering these theological schools each year, primarily to seek either initial credentials or advanced education for church ministry careers.

Table 4 provides a different view of these data. The preceding tables have tabulated persons registered, regardless of the extent of their commitment to study. Table 4 reports on persons studying full time; or in the instance of part-time students, their full-time equivalency. Here the growth rate has not been nearly so phenomenal. These data are not available for the full span of years included in Table 1, since they have been received only since 1978. However, in this five-year period the average student load has diminished from 78.0% of a full load of studies down to 70.6%, a reduction of almost ten percent in such a brief time. It seems clear that, while more persons continue to come to seminaries for educa-

tion, they tend increasingly to be part-time students. Although no data are available on the age of students, deans and registrars indicate a trend toward older persons, often making a career change, and frequently with families to support. Hence more part-time study is probably inevitable. This phenomenon has been well-known in the rest of higher education since the end of World War II; it has come to schools of theology only recently.

However, the part-time rate of study is not uniform across the several types of program offered. The Master of Divinity, the standard degree preparing one for ordination, enrolls by far the largest number of persons, and they register for an average load of 81.2%, well above the overall average load of 70.6%. However, even this is falling rather rapidly. In 1978 the M.Div. ratio was 90.5%; in 1979 (89.9%); in 1980 (89.2%); in 1981 (87.1%); and in 1982 (86.7%). The rate of drop became more rapid this year. Doctor of Education and Music students have an even higher ratio, 90.9% and 84.9% respectively. All of the others fall below the 70.6% average.

Regional enrollment patterns also show some variations. The Plains region has the highest FTE ratio (76.5%). The Far West has the lowest (58.4%). The Great Lakes (74.9%), the Southeast (73.9%), New England (73.1%), and Canada (72.6%) are all above the average. In addition to the Far West, the Mideast (68.3%) and Southwest/Rocky Mountain (69.9%) are below it.

Denominational comparisons are also interesting. The Episcopal schools are most likely to have full-time students (85.1%), and the United Church of Canada least likely (59.8%). The Lutheran schools as a group are a close second to the Episcopalians (81.0%). In both instances these groups do not have large numbers of D.Min. students enrolled, the one degree program which is almost always carried out

on a part-time basis. The second lowest ratio is the Presbyterian Church, U.S.A., where there are several institutions with relatively large D.Min. enrollments. Roman Catholic schools in both nations have above average person/FTE ratios: Canada (75.8%), United States (76.9%).

Professional Degree Enrollments

Table 5 records the major degree enrollments for selected years since 1969, and some interesting comparisons are found. The M.Div., still the single most important degree, has risen in enrollment only modestly. While total seminary growth has been +84.8% since 1969, the M.Div. population grew only +38.3%, less than one-half the rate for all degrees. In contrast the D.Min. has grown from only 201 persons in 1969 to 6,514 this year! And the two-year degrees (M.R.E., M.A., M.T.S., etc.) have more than tripled. Even the certificate, diploma, and special/unclassified group has a threefold increase. Thus it does seem clear that the large growth in seminary student bodies must not be viewed without some care. Seminaries are attracting students with a wider variety of interests. The D.Min. group is largely full-time professionals already holding the M.Div. and seeking advanced competence for the performance of their duties. This is obviously not producing larger and larger numbers of clergy. Rather it is providing them with additional training for the professional work in which they are already engaged.

Further detail on D.Min. enrollments is reported in Table 6. There are two

different degrees patterns, both carrying the D.Min. designation. The "in--sequence" model is a four-year program which includes the accomplishments of the more customary three-year M.Div. and adds another full year of preordination preparation. It was this pattern which first emerged in the 1960s and was responsible for creating an interest in new approaches. The "in-ministry" track adds one additional year (usually done part-time and spread across two or three years) of advanced preparation, almost always requiring a period of full-time ministerial experience following the award of the M.Div. Through the years there has been a steady decline of interest in the in-sequence degree, both on the part of students and institutions. Table 6 indicates its extent. Enrollment dropped from 499 persons (25 schools offering the pattern) in 1975 down to 311 students in eleven schools this autumn. At the same time the in-ministry degree pattern almost doubled in registrants (up from 3,211 to 6,203; or +93.2%), and about fifty percent more institutions began to offer it. These data surely indicate that there is positive clergy response to a program which purports to provide "advanced competence in the practice of ministry."

There are some interesting enrollment contrasts in the D.Min. While women as a group constitute 24.4% of the total students, 29.9% of the in-sequence D.Min. registrants are women. It is only in this program and the two-year masters degrees that women are so well represented. By way of comparison women make up only 5.4% of the D.Min. in-ministry students, well below these ratios. While somewhat striking in contrast, this is probably to be expected. The entrance of significant numbers of women into ministry is a rather new phenomenon. Hence only a very small pool of applicants possess both the M.Div. and the years of full-time professional ministry experience which are usually prerequisite for admission. Given the substantial numbers of women now entering ministry, this situation is clearly going to change relatively soon.

The D.Min. program presents other somewhat startling contrasts. While eighty-nine institutions offer the in-ministry model, most of them have quite modest enrollments in the program. In fact, these in-ministry D.Min. students are very unevenly distributed across the Association's membership. For example, 26.2% of all D.Min. in-ministry enrollees are found in the ten Presbyterian, U.S.A. schools. Just two of those schools have 950 D.Min. students (386 in one and 564 in the other), or 15.3% of the total. One United Methodist seminary registers 333 persons in the program. One large nondenominational institution has 712 persons included in its D.Min. student body. Thus 32.2%, or almost one-third, are found in only four schools of theology, leaving the remaining two-thirds distributed across 85 schools. Full details regarding these statistics can be found in the appendices, especially tables B-2, C-1, and D-1.

#### Graduate Student Enrollments

Table 7 provides the details in summary form for selected years since 1969. The Association classifies as "graduate" those degree programs which require four or five years beyond the baccalaureate, or the M.Div. plus one to three additional years of study. The most obvious impression from the table is one of random fluctuation, up and down. This year the total graduate enrollment is the third highest on record, coming just two years after the next to lowest number ever registered. It seems clear that no simple pattern can be found to explain the phenomenon. In the early years of the 1970s the emergence of the D.Min. was thought to provide an alternative, thus leading to diminished graduate enrollments. However, as noted earlier, the D.Min. is flourishing. But the graduate master and doctoral programs continue to be attractive to approximately 4,000 persons each year. In 1982 it was 3,878; followed by 4,141 in 1983.

Doctoral enrollments are especially noteworthy. In the light of the well-known retrenchment in higher education, and the scarcity of new positions, one might expect a diminished interest in such a degree. Yet the Ph.D. enrolls 143.3% more candidates in 1983 than was the case in 1969. In fact the variations noted above hardly are found in the doctoral program. Its enrollment has been on a steadily upward trend all through the years that the Association has collected and published these data. That fact has been offset by the post-M.Div. masters

degrees, which attracted 35.1% fewer students in 1983 as contrasted with 1969. These details may also be examined in the appendices, Table C-1.

#### Sex Distribution of Theological Students

The Association has received these data from member schools since 1972, and Table 8 provides the information distributed both by sex and by selected degree programs for several years since 1972. Full details are available in Tables C-3, D-3, and E-3. All of these tables are parallel to those found in earlier editions of the Fact Book, hence permitting precise comparisons. Data on graduation can be found in Tables F-3, G-3, and H-3.

The rapid growth in the enrollment of women is demonstrated by examining the totals at the bottom of Table 8. Eleven years ago there were but 3,358 women, constituting 10.2% of the total. This year the number of women rose to 13,451, or 24.4% of enrollees, almost one of four. While the three- and four-year degrees which customarily lead to ordination still lag behind (17.0%) the overall average, even that program has demonstrated rapid change. In 1972 women were only 4.7% of its registrants. In eleven years this has more than tripled. The increase in academic doctoral students has quadrupled in that same period. Only the graduate masters has tended to diminish, although even that program has seen increased enrollment by women in the last three years.

Table 9 adds more precision to the observations above about the enrollment of women in ordination programs. Here the M.Div. and the in-sequence D.Min. have been segregated for comparison. Between 1976 and 1981 there was almost no increase in men enrollees for these two degree programs. In a five-year period when total seminary enrollments rose +17.5%, the registration of men in these programs increased only +0.8%. However, the enrollment of women in that period increased +67.7%. By

1983 this growth had risen further to become +93.5%! Both 1982 and 1983 apparently reversed one trend of the five previous years, namely that male enrollment in these ordination programs was tending to decline in absolute numbers. In 1982 the number rose, after five years of slight decline, and it rose again in 1983. Nonetheless the 23,202 men enrolled in 1983 were sixty-four persons fewer than was the situation in 1977. And during that period seminary enrollments rose by almost 10,000 persons, with none of this growth bringing additional numbers of men to the ordination programs. In summary, in 1976 women were only 11.5% of the students in ordination programs. By 1983 they had become 19.5% of the total. During that time the numbers of male registrants has virtually stood still.

Table 10 provides data on the results of this increased enrollment of women in the graduate, post-M.Div. programs. It is immediately apparent that 1982-83 was not as productive a year as the preceding one. In that year, 1981-82, the largest numbers of women ever reported received both graduate masters and academic doctoral degrees, comprising 23.5% of the former and 20.8% of the latter. This pace was not repeated in the following year. But one must examine both the numbers of women

being graduated and the percentage of the total as well. In the instance of the masters degrees, there was a drop in both numbers and percentage, representing a real reduction in ratio. Such was not the case in doctoral degrees awarded. While 23.2% fewer women received doctorates, this was a reduction in percentage of only 0.3%. That is, there was a substantial overall reduction in numbers of persons receiving doctorates (male and female) during 1982-83. And this affected women on almost precisely the same statistical basis as men. It is clear that the number of women available for teaching positions is increasing year by year, but the rate of increase implied by the 1981-82 data was not sustained in 1982-83. However, as Table 10 indicates, the trend across the years is clearly upward. Not only are larger numbers of women beginning these programs, they are also completing them and receiving the appropriate degrees.

Table 11 provides parallel information about women receiving the professional degrees. The field of church education has been one area of full time service open to women for many years. Hence the reader should not be surprised to find that 41.4% of the Master of Religious Education graduates last year were women. As more

and more women enter ordained ministry, one might expect that percentage to drop gradually. However Table 11 does not indicate any support for that projection. Even as women are seeking and obtaining ordination credentials, their ratio among M.R.E. graduates continues to rise.

The women graduates in the Master of Divinity program present a far more striking contrast. As noted above, total M.Div. enrollments have been moving upward at a very modest pace, when compared to other degree programs. But the role of women in the M.Div. has been rising at a rapid rate, and this is reflected in the numbers of graduates. In just six years (since 1976-77) women M.Div. recipients have increased 157.4% (from 462 to 1,189). In that same period of time men M.Div. graduates rose by only 6.6% (from 5,158 to 5,497). This sharp contrast is highlighted even more when the data in Tables 11 and 19 are compared. During 1982-1983 overall M.Div. recipients actually decreased by 217 persons, but the numbers of women increased by nineteen (from 1,170 to 1,189). Or, to state this even more clearly, while the number of women receiving the M.Div. rose by nineteen, male graduates decreased by 236.

The situation with respect to the in-sequence D.Min. presents an interesting

contrast. As Table 11 reveals, here the numbers of women graduates have fluctuated across the years. But that has also been the characteristic of total numbers of graduates. Note for example, the data for the last two years: thirty women graduates constituted 28.6% of the D.Min. class in 1981-82. Last year this dropped to sixteen women, but they were still 26.7% of the total. There was a total of only 60 D.Min. in-sequence graduates last year, in comparison with 105 the preceding year. The steadily diminishing enrollments in this track of the D.Min. program are now being fully reflected in graduation statistics. Thus, even though the program seems to be gradually disappearing, the role of women in it remains strong, even though the actual numbers are not growing very much.

Table 12 pushes these data one additional step by examining them within denominational categories. Ordination graduates here are defined as persons receiving either the M.Div. or the D.Min. in-sequence. While there is some up/down fluctuation from year to year, it is apparent from the table that both the numbers and percentages of the total represented by women have increased since 1976-77. In the United Church of Christ women are about one-half of the candidates ready for ordination consideration. For the United Church of Canada this ratio is around 40%; for Episcopalians, Presbyterian, U.S.A., and United Methodists it approximates 30%. Other church bodies have lower rates. Even the churches of the Southern Baptist Convention, a group which has traditionally been unwilling to approve the ordination of women, find themselves with steadily increasing numbers of women fully prepared for ordination (92 women, or 8.4% of the total graduates last year).

Persons interested in additional details regarding the role of women in theological schools should consult Tables C-3, D-3, and E-3 for enrollment data and Tables F-3, G-3, and H-3 for graduation statistics.

### Black Student Enrollment

These data have been received from member schools since fall 1970, and the successive Fact Books have contained them. Table 13 provides a summary of this information. The reader will note that the numbers of blacks enrolled in seminaries has risen steadily across the years. The average rate of increase per year has been 10.3%, which is more than double the average total enrollment increase of 4.5%. However, the reader must be careful when using these statistics. Black enrollment started from such a low point that phenomenal rates of growth have still

not produced large numbers of black students. And the ratio that black students represent in the total theological school population has only doubled within this thirteen year period, moving upward from 2.6% in 1970 and reaching 5.2% in 1983. This is far below the black percentage of the total population, estimated by the 1980 census to be 11.7% in the United States. This reflects the fact that blacks

continue to be an "underrepresented constituency" in Association schools. And one must also keep in mind that 645, or 22.4%, of these black students are found in the five schools which have traditionally served an almost exclusively black clientele. This means that the remaining 2,236 black students are distributed across the 190 additional member seminaries. Actually this distribution is very uneven. There are 44 member institutions with no black students. Eleven of these are in Canada, while twenty-two are Roman Catholic. The largest number of blacks in a denominational grouping of schools is the 397 black students enrolled in the United Methodist schools. The American Baptist group has 283 blacks, but one of these seminaries is among the five traditionally black institutions. There are 202 blacks enrolled in the six Southern Baptist theological schools, and 182 in the ten Presbyterian, U.S.A. institutions. Table D-2 indicates that there are 1009 black registrants in the twenty inter- and nondenominational member schools, but two of these are the two largest primarily black seminaries which together enroll 465 blacks, leaving the remaining 544 black students distributed across the other eighteen institutions in this group.

Table 14 provides a sex distribution for the 2,881 black students in the several degree categories utilized above. It is readily apparent that the general increase in women's enrollment noted earlier has also characterized the growing role of black women. In fact, their rate of increase is much greater than that for black men, since the latter are a steadily diminishing proportion of the total number of blacks in seminaries. In 1972 black men were 91.3% of the black student population. By 1983 this had dropped to 75.2%. Or to state the statistic a bit differently, in that eleven year interval black men have increased in number by 123.6%; but black women's numbers have risen by 676.1%! This growth rate is even more startling in some of the separate degree programs. For example: black women

ordination candidates rose from 34 (5.0% of blacks in these programs) in 1972 to 399 (20.0%) in 1983. Black women doctoral students numbered but one person in 1972 (1.8% of black doctoral students). In 1983 there were 33 black women registered in doctoral programs, and they were 36.7% of the total. This one degree program best illustrates the increasing role for black women. In 1972 there were 55 black males in such programs; in 1983 this had risen to only 57 men. At the same time the numbers of black women rose from one to thirty-three! There have been additional increases in the other degree categories found in Table 14.

Table 15 presents the accumulated data on black graduate degree recipients across the past decade. The fairly stable nature of the enrollment of black students in these degrees has already been noted, and the numbers of graduates across the years tend to confirm this observation. The customary fluctuations found in all graduate degree programs appear, since the normal time patterns applicable to other degrees (i.e., two years for the M.R.E., etc.) are probably not applicable. And Table 15 reveals that such is the case. Black students receiving graduate

masters degrees have ranged from a low of seven (1975-76) to a high of eighteen last year. And similarly black doctoral awards have ranged from four (in two different years) to ten on three occasions. It was nine last year. From these data one must draw the conclusion that there is no discernable increase in the numbers of black graduates joining the ranks of those qualified to teach in theological schools, completing the requirements for degrees at this level. The post-M.Div. masters degrees were received by eighteen blacks (2.9% of the total), while doctoral graduates numbered only nine.

Readers interested in full details regarding black enrollment and graduation data should consult Tables C-2, D-2, E-2, F-2, G-2, and H-2 in this and earlier editions of this publication.

#### Hispanic/American Enrollment

The Association of Theological Schools has been collecting this information on student enrollment since 1972, and Table 16 presents a summary of women/men distributions within the same degree categories utilized in earlier tables. The observations regarding women's and black enrollment made above are, in a general way, also applicable here. In 1972 there were only 264 Hispanic/American registrants. By 1983 this had risen to 1,381, up 423.1%. In that span of years total enrollments rose only 66.8%. Thus the rate of growth was more than six times greater, obviously indicating that Hispanic increase cannot be explained simply as a part of the general enrollment increase. However, before one becomes overly impressed with this phenomenon, keep in mind that these 1,381 persons are only 2.5% of seminarians, and this is far below the ratio of Hispanics in the population. Hence, while there is improvement, there is also far to go before Hispanics will cease to be "underrepresented" in theological schools.

A careful examination of the table reveals other observations also. The most striking is that much of this new enrollment has come in the special/unclassified student category (usually those merely taking graduate courses, often because they do not qualify for regular admission). This year 33.5% of the total Hispanic group is found here. This is hardly an encouraging fact, since just two years ago only 13.6% were enrolled there. Black registration in this category in 1983 was only 14.1%, women were 19.5%, Pacific/Asians 14.6%, and the total student population was 12.2%. Thus, while one can be encouraged by the growth, this appreciation must be tempered by the realization that a substantial part of the rise has come with persons who probably will not qualify for graduate degrees nor will they receive the credentials which are required by most church groups for ministerial service.

Table 16 also contains other information of interest. There is little encouraging data in the post-M.Div. graduate enrollments. Not many Hispanic seminary degree recipients pursue the kind of graduate study which prepares one for theological seminary teaching. As Hispanic enrollments continue to mount, and more schools seek Hispanic faculty, this information does not indicate the emergence of a pool of persons trained in the normal ways (i.e., the academic doctorate) to respond to invitations to teach, an unfortunate circumstance. In contrast, the rise in ordination candidates is substantial, and their percentage of total Hispanic enrollment matches almost exactly the ratio in the total student population. Hence, the excessive registration in the special/unclassified category apparently has not adversely affected the full preparation of Hispanic students for the ordained ministry, including the earning of the normal credentials.

As was noted for black students, neither are Hispanics distributed evenly across the Association's membership. One seminary in Puerto Rico, which primarily

serves Hispanics, enrolls 175, or 12.7% of the total. And forty percent of the schools, seventy-eight, register no Hispanic students at all. This leaves 1,207 students distributed across 116 institutions.

Full details regarding Hispanic student enrollments can be found in Tables C-4, D-4, E-4, F-4, G-4, and H-4, the latter three presenting the data for graduates during the 1982-83 academic year. All of these tables are parallel to those with the same designations in earlier Fact Books, thus facilitating comparisons across a range of years.

#### Pacific/Asian American Scholars

Pacific/Asian American students are defined as "persons from Asian and Pacific Island ancestry, whether born abroad, in North America, or the trust territories of the Pacific Ocean." These data have been received for the past seven years, beginning in 1977. The summaries for each year can be found in all Fact Books as Tables C-5, D-5, and E-5, with graduation information in the parallel format found in Tables F-5, G-5, and H-5. Observations above regarding other groups are also appropriate here, especially with respect to increased registrations. And this is found in all of the degree categories. The role of women is a growing one, as found elsewhere, although their ratio to men is below that found for all students. In fact, both Hispanic and black women are present in higher ratios than is the situation with Pacific/Asian women. However, it should be noted that Pacific/Asians as a group are more likely to be enrolled in academic doctoral programs than any other group. There is currently 6.3% of total enrollments here, as contrasted with 4.7% in the total student population, 1.8% of Hispanics, 3.1% of blacks, and 4.5% of all women. The enrollment of this rather small body of students is not at all equally distributed geographically. Ninety member schools, or 46.2%, enroll

none at all. The largest concentration of Pacific/Asian students is in the twenty inter-/nondenominational schools which together have 227 enrollees (29.1%). Next in size are the 103 persons (13.2% of the total) in the six Southern Baptist institutions. United Methodist schools of theology follow closely (101 or 13.0%), with Presbyterian, U.S.A. third (82 or 10.5%). Regional distributions are similarly unbalanced. The Far West schools (California and Oregon) have 338 of the total, or 43.4%. Next is 120 in the Great Lakes region (15.4%), with the Mideast close behind (111 or 14.2%).

#### Native American Enrollment

These are persons of Native American Indian or Eskimo origin, and the data have been received for only the last five years. Since the numbers are so small, they have not as yet been subjected to data processing, and the information which appears in Table 18 cannot be found among the tables included in the appendices. The table reveals that growth here has been quite slow. The current enrollment of

numbers have now reached 51 persons, up from only 29 in 1979. The graduate numbers are quite small, and there does not appear to be any discernable improvement. These few persons are distributed across 38 different schools, with the highest registration being nineteen Native Americans in one institution, with four others having from seven to nine registrants. The only graduates this year among Native Americans (13 in number) all received the M.Div. degree.

#### Changes in Numbers of Graduates

Table 19 reports the numbers of persons receiving degrees which the Association has designated as "professional." First among these is, of course, the Master of Divinity, the degree accepted by most church bodies as the appropriate preparation for ordained ministry. Since 1973-74 there has been a modest but nonetheless

steady increase in the numbers of M.Div. graduates year by year. This has been so regular that last year's edition of this volume indicated that the number would probably exceed 7,000 for the first time in 1982-83 data. As Table 19 reveals, this did not happen. Only 6,686 persons were graduated, a full 217 fewer than the previous year. This was actually less M.Div. graduates than each of the last three years. The plateau in M.Div. enrollments, which occurred in the late 1970s (noted above in Table 5), is now being reflected in the statistics for program completion. There were 3.1% fewer M.Div. graduates in 1982-83.

Similar results were reported for the D.Min. programs. There the reduction was 8.0%, after eleven successive years of steady growth in graduates. The explanation is probably related to the M.Div. phenomenon. In the early years of the D.Min. there were rapid leaps upward in enrollment each year. But beginning in the late 1970s this rate of growth dropped dramatically, with only modest gains reported annually. The graduation data are now reflecting this change. When one adds the complicating factor of D.Min. projects (where completion often carries no particular time requirements and is dependent on the self-sustained motivation and energy of the candidate, who is probably also engaged full time in ministry), one might expect a reasonably stable enrollment to result in fluctuating graduation data. Table 19 indicates that this may have begun to occur for the D.Min.

The results for the one- and two-year degree are in contrast with the above observations. With but one exception (1972-73) there has been a steady increase in numbers of graduates from these programs. In most years this has been less than ten percent, but the rate has been upward. This year the increase was 4.2%, reflecting the rising enrollment pace reported in Table 5.

Table 20 provides parallel information for the graduation data among the

several doctoral degrees. The doctorate in religious education is a rather small enterprise, limited to only a few schools. And the graduation data illustrate this

restricted existence. The largest graduating group was 28 persons (1979-80), with 24 last year. The range has been from a low of six to the high of twenty-eight. Th.D./S.T.D. data can be misleading, since this is merely another name for the Ph.D. in some institutions. (The former days when the Ph.D. was awarded only by universities and the Th.D./S.T.D. only by freestanding seminaries no longer prevail. And some freestanding schools during the period reported in Table 20 have simply changed the name of the existing degree, making for further confusion in using these data.) Nonetheless, even with the diminished Th.D./S.T.D. enrollments, reported above in Table 7, last year the Th.D. graduates rose to 48 persons. It seems quite obvious that this statistic is doomed to fluctuation. For the last five years graduates have numbered 87, 40, 79, 32, and 48. The enrollments in

those same years were quite stable, ranging from a low of 437 to a high of only 478, a factor which would ordinarily lead one to expect similarly stable graduation data. Not so!

The graduates with the Ph.D. are also reported in Table 20. The same type of fluctuation prevails there also. Ph.D. recipients in the last seven years have been, successively, 171, 224, 204, 189, 230, 363, and 259. The large number (363) in 1981-82 was 40.2% higher than the next highest year, making this a most unexpected phenomenon. It may be that this was simply a one-year experience which does not readily lend itself to explanation, and it probably should not be utilized in any efforts to discern trends in Ph.D. production. Since enrollments in the Ph.D. have risen substantially in the last two years (up 25.7% over fall 1981), it can reasonably be expected that larger numbers of graduates will be forthcoming in three or four years.

#### Changes in School Size and Comparative Enrollments

Table 21 is new this year, having been derived from a comparison of this and previous volumes. As indicated at the outset of this chapter in Table 1, there has been a steady and substantial increase in the number of students enrolled across the years, accompanied by a much smaller increase in the number of member schools. Average enrollment has risen from 175.38 per school in 1969 to 282.63 in 1983. Table 21 reports those changes in terms of the five size distributions utilized by the Fact Book, and reports the changing percentages of schools in each size group and the percentage of students enrolled in each group. As one might expect, the most startling data are in the smallest and largest size categories. In 1969 there were 25 schools (14.7%) with fifty or fewer students, and 2.5% of all students were enrolled in these twenty-five institutions. Despite a 14.7% increase in the number of schools, by 1983 there were only 15 institutions with fifty or less students

(down to 7.7% of total institutions), enrolling only 0.9% of total students. Thus, while smaller schools continue to exist, their numbers continually decrease and they serve a rapidly diminishing percentage of the total student population.

At the opposite end of the size scale precisely reversed results are evident. In 1969 only eleven institutions registered over 500 persons. This rose to 24 in 1983. And the ratio of total institutions which these twenty-four comprise almost doubled (up from 6.5% to 12.3%). Similar dramatic changes are apparent in the students served. Those eleven seminaries in 1969 were enrolling about one-fourth (26.2%) of all students. The twenty-four in 1983 register almost half (45.7%) of the students. And, as will be discussed later in this volume, they provide education for 45.7% of the students while spending only 31.1% of the total theological school expenditures.

The reader will find similar data for the three middle size categories by studying Table 21. This table was prepared from information contained in Tables C or C-1 for the Fact Books in each of the years cited.

NUMBER AND DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONNEL

Tables O through V in this and earlier Fact Books provide the detailed information about theological schools' professional employees. Since the tables have maintained their precisely parallel nature across the years, it is possible to make

very accurate comparisons from year to year. The customary distributions by size and status, denomination, and region are included.

Table 22 is a summary of this information regarding administrators, faculty, and librarians for selected years since fall 1970. The table reports the total numbers of persons in each category, the average number per school (to eliminate the effect of constantly changing numbers of member schools), and the percentage of change from the previous year. For purposes of comparison the same data are provided for student enrollments, permitting ready analysis of total personnel trends (professional employees and students).

When the percentage of change for total professional personnel is compared with the rise in enrollment, it is apparent that student bodies are increasing much more rapidly than are the staff to serve their educational needs. In no year does the percentage of change for personnel match the percentage of student growth. The largest rise in personnel per school is found in the administrators' category. Between 1970 and 1983 the average number of professional administrative personnel per school rose by 31.3%, while the increase of faculty was 8.7%, and librarians only 0.9%. However, one should not be misled by these percentages. The almost one-third growth in administrators involved only slightly more than one person per school, from an average of 4.19 administrators to 5.5 per school. These numbers are obviously not excessive in any sense. While the student body was increasing by 62.8% in these thirteen years, full-time faculty rose only 8.7%. This fact must be tempered by the following table's data. At the same time that full-time faculty were increasing so very modestly, part-time instructional personnel were becoming far more numerous. And in the meantime, the library staffs remain about the same, with just slightly more than two professionals employed in each library on the average.

As noted above, Table 23 extends this analysis by examining the role of part-time instructional personnel in seminary teaching. In the period between 1971 and 1983 full time faculty have increased in total numbers of persons employed from

2,297 to 2,542 (up 10.7%). In that same interval the part-time persons offering instruction have risen from 1,498 to 2,944 (up 96.5%). And translated into full-time equivalency, these persons moved from 429 FTE to 840 FTE (up 95.8%). Furthermore, the proportion of total instruction offered by part-time instructors moved from 15.7% of the total to 24.8% this year. All of this means that today about one out of every four classes offered by a theological school is being taught by a person whose relationship to the instructional work of that institution is part time. When compared with the rest of higher education, this is not particularly surprising. However, given the historic reliance of seminaries on full-time staff for all or virtually all of their teaching, it is obviously a new phenomenon. When one

considers the move toward extension, off-campus instruction which is characteristic of many seminaries, this trend toward additional part-time staff is probably inevitable. Table 23 provides the changing picture of this situation across the years.

Distribution of Personnel by Sex

Tables O through V also provide these data for administrative, faculty, and library personnel distributed across both sex and race categories. Tables 24, 25, and 26 summarize this information and report it from the several successive Fact Books published annually. This year the data in Table 24 are somewhat perplexing, in that there is an apparent reduction in numbers of administrative personnel by

sixteen persons total, while at the same time an increase of twenty-five in the number of women reported is indicated. There is no reason to question the accuracy of the latter data, although the former may be somewhat questionable. Instructions for completing the annual reports indicate that persons with divided administrative and teaching roles are to be listed as administrators only if more than one-half of

their time is devoted thereto. Conversely, if they teach more than one-half time, the proper location for the listing is in the faculty data. Since there was some confusion about this, the instructions were revised to provide clearer assistance. It may well be that nothing has really changed, except for the manner of reporting. That is, the same numbers of persons are employed but the classification has altered. That observation is editorial conjecture, but it reflects the fact that other sources of knowledge about the member schools hardly confirm the elimination of forty-one positions previously occupied by males. Nonetheless it is obvious that additional women continue to be employed as administrators, and the pace is accelerating. The number has risen by fifty-three persons in just two years, a more rapid rate of growth than that experienced in previous periods. Table 24 provides these data.

Table 25 provides parallel information regarding faculty, and these distributions have been received from member schools since 1971. In that year there were only 73 women teaching full time in theological seminaries. A dozen years later, by 1983, this had risen to 269 women, and the ratio of women to men had grown from but 3.2% to 10.6%. The rate of increase has actually accelerated a bit in the last three years. Similar data are found at the bottom of the table for the adjunct or part-time teaching staff who are women. Here the ratio has always been somewhat higher than among the full-time instructors, moving from 6.9% in 1971 to 18.0% this current year, a not quite threefold increase. The Table 25 data illustrate the fact that the more rapid rate of increase among women employed full time does not prevail with the adjunct group. Here the increase appears to be more heavily weighted toward the employment of men, by way of contrast.

Table 26 examines this information for a shorter period of time but with more precision, since it shows changes for each professional position. There continues to be no woman serving as chief administrator in a theological school, the one woman identified last year having served in an interim capacity which has now drawn to a close. And there was a drop in numbers of women serving as assistant chief administrators this year. However, every other identified administrative post now

has more women employed than was the situation in 1982. This accounts for the growth from 231 women to 256 this year.

Women faculty also continue to increase in numbers, as Table 26 indicates. For the first time fewer women were reported at the full professor level, a statistic which is a bit startling. However, every other rank did add to its complement

of women this year. The traditionally tenured positions (full and associate professors) were held by 128 women, up from 116 last year, and 97 in 1981. While from one viewpoint these increases are commendable, it is quite obvious that women still are significantly underrepresented on seminary faculties. The numbers of women teaching in an adjunct role have already been discussed above, and further comment seems unnecessary.

The situation with respect to women employed as professional library staff is somewhat different. This year there was an increase of twelve women among full-time library employees, while at the same time women working part-time in theological libraries are five fewer. Overall, women account for 55.2% of library staff, a percentage which just matches that which had been reached in 1979-80. Hence the gains indicated for the one year in reality merely restore the status of women which prevailed four years ago! The specific positions and the data in successive years for each are reported for the past four years in Table 26.

#### Professional Employment Data for Blacks

Table 27 parallels the preceding one in format, but it provides information regarding the employment of blacks among administration, faculty, and library categories. An initial overall glance at the table will indicate that there is but one position with major change, that of adjunct faculty. Thirty additional blacks were reported there this year. Among administrators the increase was only two, with full-time faculty it was but one, and with librarians only two persons. Hence the rate of increase can at best be described as almost glacial in character. (Since the submitting of these data, the one black chief administrator serving in a primarily white institution has resigned to accept a position outside theological education.)

There is one further qualification to these data which must be acknowledged. Ten of the black administrators serve in the five primarily black institutions, leaving but thirty for the other 190 schools. Thirty-five of the 104 full-time black faculty teach in these five seminaries, with but 69 distributed across the primarily white theological schools. Thirty-six of the 114 black adjunct faculty

are in these five institutions, as are six of the sixteen librarians. Hence, the data clearly indicate that, despite very modest gains, there is still very little "black presence" in schools of theology.

## COMPENSATION

Table NN-VV in the appendices provide full details regarding total compensation for professional staff employed in non-Roman Catholic institutions. Staff in Roman Catholic schools have been eliminated from these averages because of the "contributed services" aspect of compensation and the variety of ways this is treated in the Canadian and United States Catholic member schools. Please note that the amounts listed are total compensation, not just cash salary paid. Total compensation includes cash salary, housing allowance (if any) or rental value of housing provided, institutional payments for fringe benefits (insurance, etc.), and the institutional contribution to pensions. Compensation for administrative staff is for a twelve-month period, while faculty compensation is for nine months (the regular academic year). Extra compensation, such as summer school salaries, is not included in these quotations.

Readers interested in the full details should study the appendices of this and earlier Fact Books with care. It will be evident from such an analysis that there is considerable variety in patterns of compensation. Two total compensation amounts which are very similar may, in fact, have considerable variation in the components. Some institutions choose to pay larger cash salaries and provide little in fringe benefits or only very modest pension support. Other schools, providing much the same total compensation, may have a considerably lower cash salary but offer extensive benefits in insurance, family medical coverage, educational allowances for children, and substantial contributions to pension plans. Hence, the reader must be very careful when comparing "salaries" to be certain that the entire package of cash and the value of other benefits has been included in the evaluation.

Inflation has been a major factor for the past several years in its impact on compensation patterns. Hence, one must take it into account when evaluating the progress of remuneration. While total compensation has been steadily rising, year after year, the rate of growth has often failed to match the increase in the cost of living index. And professional staff in schools of theology have fallen further behind each year in maintaining pace with the cost of living rise. After a number of years in which inflation hovered at the "double digit" level (+10.7%, +13.2%, +11.3% for five, four, and three years ago, respectively), it has dropped sharply in the last two years (+6.5% and 2.4%). The drop during academic year 1982-83 was especially dramatic, since the last half of 1982 and the first half of 1983 brought very little increase. Hence, while compensation growth during the double-digit years always fell substantially below the index, the last two years there has been some recovery from these losses. All of the tables included in the text have been designed to show the impact of inflation on the rising salaries. In contrast, the tables found in the appendices do not reflect adjustments for inflation, and they should be used with care.

#### Administrative Compensation

Table 28 summarizes the data for each administrative position for the past five years. This information is taken from Table NN in the appendices of this and earlier editions. Tables OO and PP provide this same information distributed by denomination and by region/highest degree offered categories. Among the accredited schools eight of the nine positions received compensation increases in excess of the cost of living growth, the public relations directors being the only exception. There was in fact a real reduction in compensation for that position. Overall accredited administrative staff increases exactly tripled the inflation index. When added to last year's slight gain, there has been a cumulative +5.8% recovery from

the losses encountered in the earlier years. Table 28 also includes data for administrative personnel in candidate and associate member institutions, designated collectively as "other." Here two of the positions received real losses, while all of the others exhibit increases, all in excess of the +2.4% inflationary factor. As a group these administrative personnel received somewhat higher increases in

compensation than that experienced by the accredited schools (+8.3% and +7.2%, respectively). Thus both groups of schools reflect the continued efforts of theological schools to overcome earlier losses to inflation.

### Faculty Compensation

The same detailed information regarding faculty total compensation is provided in Tables 29-34. Total compensation includes cash salary, housing allowance, value of fringe benefits, and school contribution to pension. Last year was the first time since 1976-77 that faculty compensation had matched the rise in the cost of living, and that achievement was repeated again this year for faculty in both accredited and other institutions. However, the importance of this two-year improvement should not be overestimated, since it follows five consecutive years of loss to the cost of living. In fact, during the past eleven years, there have been eight years of net losses to inflation (a total of -19.6%). The three years of gains (1976-77 and the last two years) total only +7.9%, far below the losses. As will be evident in subsequent tables below, theological school compensation will have to grow at a rate substantially in excess of inflation for several more years to regain a position comparable to the base year (1969) when these data were first received and published. The tables in the text have been designed to illustrate the impact of inflation quite clearly. Tables 29 and 32 report the dollar amounts of compensation for seven successive years. Tables 30 and 33 translate these sums into percentages of dollar change. Tables 31 and 34 apply the effect of inflation to these percentages, providing the net real change in compensation after inflation. The first three tables (Tables 29-31) are for the accredited schools, the latter three tables (Tables 32-34) for candidate and associate institutions. Full details are in the appendices, including faculty compensation data distributed by denomination (Table RR), region, and highest degree offered (Table SS).

Library Staff Compensation

Table 35 summarizes the data for library staff compensation across the past four years. Full details are available in Tables TT, UU, and VV in the appendices. Accredited school library staff are receiving an additional +6.2% in compensation

during 1983-84, indicating that they have enjoyed salary increases in excess of inflation for the past two years. For reasons that are not at all clear, library staff in other candidate and associate schools exhibit a net loss of -5.8% in income this year. It should be noted that the average salary reported for 1982-83 showed an unexpectedly high increase over the previous year, followed by a loss this year. There is no readily obvious explanation for these data.

Summary

The preceding tables provide compensation amounts and comparisons only across a few recent years. The Association of Theological Schools began to receive and publish these data in the 1969-70 academic year, a time when the excessive inflationary experiences of the 1970s had not yet begun. Hence a summary table reporting the situation with respect to compensation comparisons across those fourteen

years may give the reader better perspective on the economic condition of professional staff today, as contrasted with that base line year. Table 36 provides this information in summary fashion for administrative, faculty, and library staff in both accredited and other school categories. In that period the consumer price index has risen by +171.3%, a tremendous rate of growth. No single group of professional employees in theological schools has matched that increase. Administrators

and faculty in the other school category came closest (+158.8), with librarians (+156.9%) and faculty (+155.6%) in accredited institutions not far behind. At the other end of the scale candidate and associate school librarians received the least additional compensation (+116.4%). Accredited school administrators are receiving the largest dollar amounts of compensation, but this average was only fifth among the six groups in matching the impact of inflation.

Table 37 supplements this information, by confining the data to the last five years. In this period the cumulative inflationary rate has been +52.1%, and the

gains of the past two years bring professional staff in schools of theology somewhat closer to matching this growth. In fact, faculty in candidate and associate schools actually surpassed inflation (+56.7%) during this period. The poorest record during the five years was recorded for other school administrative staff. One must inevitably conclude from this table that the losses sustained in the first three of the last five years have almost been recovered, but the earlier losses (prior to 1978-79) have not been addressed by the improvements in compensation experienced recently. Additional compensation growth in excess of inflation will be necessary for several more years to bring salaries back to their 1969-70 relationship with the consumer price index.

## FINANCES -- REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES

Tables AA-JJ provide the overall financial information for the ATS schools of theology for the academic year 1982-83. The reader can find these in the appendices. There are two sets of tables supplied. Each table includes the appropriate dollar amounts, the ratio of educational and general revenue/expenditure which that represents (stated as a percentage), and the calculated per student sum. As noted, the tables with the suffix -1 provide the student data on a "head count" basis. Those with a -2 suffix utilize the "full-time equivalency" enrollment. In some groupings, especially where there are large numbers of part-time students, the per-student costs will differ quite markedly. This information is provided this year for the third successive year, and tables in this and the preceding two Fact Books are parallel and may be used directly to arrive at comparisons, subject to the exception noted below.

One major change was made in the forms sent to member schools this year. For some time knowledgeable observers have been convinced that the data being supplied by at least some seminaries were inaccurate as a result of imprecise instructions and varying interpretations of the requests. In some instances institutions appeared to be having substantial surpluses year after year, when audited reports examined during accrediting visits, or on other occasions, indicated that revenue/expenditures were more nearly in balance. This was caused by the varying ways that student aid was being reported for revenue purposes. To illustrate, ATS has always provided a revenue line item labeled "student aid." Occasionally it appeared that funds contributed for student aid were included on this line as income. If those same funds were then granted to a student for the purpose of paying tuition, the same dollars were reported a second time as tuition. But the actual funds had not

been doubled; only the reporting. Sometimes parallel double reporting on the expenditure side did not appear to offset this duplication. And even if it did, the data were arbitrarily inflated in an inaccurate way. To compound the problem, there was no certain way to determine how many or even which schools might be involved.

To test this hypothesis ATS requested a netting of both tuition and auxiliary enterprise income when those charges to students were actually being "paid" by a student aid grant. Although the forms sent to schools erroneously failed to provide for parallel netting in the expenditure ledger, ATS staff adjusted the submitted data to achieve this accuracy. When this was done, the final effect does appear at least partially to verify the advance concern. Unfortunately not all member schools were able to comply with this request to provide net figures for these two items. There is a group of seminaries which distribute all student aid as a total sum by check to the student without designating whether it shall be spent for tuition, board/room, or otherwise. Financial aid is simply viewed wholistically, not in these discrete categories. Hence these schools could not provide data permitting net income in these two categories. To the extent that this inability to comply with the request prevails, the magnitude of this double reporting is not yet clear. However, the following tables do indicate some dimensions of the changed data which emerge as a result of the more precise reporting techniques utilized this year.

Table 38 summarizes the total financial data reported this year under these newer instructions. Please observe the footnote to the table. The change in reporting methodology no longer permits any claim of precise comparability with previous years. Nonetheless the Association is reasonably certain that the 1982-83

data, while not exactly parallel, are nevertheless more accurate than the earlier data. The size of the increase in both revenues and expenditures clearly reflects

this change. In the preceding five years the average revenue increase was 11.5%. Last year it was but 2.1%. The parallel expenditure comparisons are 11.1% average

for five years and 3.2%, respectively. Thus, one can be reasonably certain that there were numerous instances of "double reporting" in the previous data. Much of this has now been eliminated. Had the older reporting procedures been followed unchanged again this year, the increase in revenues would have been 9.2%; expenditures 10.6%. The reader will also note in Table 38 the net result in the surplus/deficit situation within theological schools. The indicated "surplus" of 1981-82 was reduced by more than one-third for 1982-83, down from almost \$10 million to slightly more than \$6 million. One can only speculate whether this surplus figure would have been higher or lower if all 195 member schools had been able to report in full compliance with the revised instructions.

The reader should not be misled by this multimillion dollar surplus. While at first glance it appears to be substantial, in fact it is just \$31,400 per member school; only \$162.50 per full-time equivalent student; even less \$116.46 per head count student. Stated in this manner, these are not particularly impressive surpluses, especially when compared with the fact that it cost \$9,177 to provide education for each full-time student during 1982-83 in accredited member schools. Last year's Fact Book noted that for the first time the auxiliary enterprise category appeared to indicate a surplus. This would include the charges levied for food, housing, bookstore, etc., as compared with the expenditures incurred in providing those services. In every previous year a deficit had prevailed. Whether last year's "surplus" was real or merely apparent cannot be proved with any certainty. But it is clear that it was a onetime phenomenon. This year, perhaps enhanced by the impact of the revenue netting procedure, there is a more than \$3 million reported deficit. If deficits in these services are going to be regularly prevalent, it seems obvious that management attention to this situation is needed.

Table 39 provides some additional perspectives on this new reporting procedure.

Here the total seminary enterprise data (as reported in the previous table) are presented on a revenue/expenditure per full-time student basis for the past three years. Note the percent of change rows at the bottom of the revenue and expenditure categories. Two years ago (using the older manner of reporting) the revenue gain was +13.2%; last year it was but +0.9% per full-time student. The expenditure data are +12.2% and +2.0% respectively. When one compares the revenue enhancement of but 0.9% while expenditures rose 2.0%, the decrease in the surplus noted above is again apparent. Note also the student aid rows for both. Student aid as a

revenue category has been eliminated totally. The \$647 per student in student aid within accredited schools during 1981-82 became zero in 1982-83. This does not mean that contributions designated for student aid disappeared last year. They continued as in the past. However, they are now reported in terms of source: endowment proceeds, gifts, or grants. This makes student aid income parallel to all other income, designated and otherwise. The student aid expenditure line reveals the extent by which some member institutions were unable to comply with the new reporting. \$182 per student (in accredited schools) and \$250 per student (in the other schools) could not be subjected to the netting process used by most institutions.

The reader will also want to examine the revenue/expenditure totals for the "other category" of institutions. In the first two years the overall surplus situation noted above was found there, as well as in the accredited group. In 1980-81 it was \$129 per student; in 1981-82 down to \$44 per student; but with surpluses both years. For 1982-83 the surplus has disappeared entirely, and a \$71 deficit prevails. Thus the total surplus of slightly more than \$6 million noted earlier is not the product of the unaccredited institutions. Among the accredited schools the comparable sums are surpluses of \$172 in 1980-81; \$279 in 1981-82; and \$181 in 1982-83.

Further evidence of the impact of these reporting changes are evident when one compares Tables AA-1 in each of the last two years. Consistently across the years tuition revenue in accredited institutions has been between 27% and 29%. This year the percentage dropped to 22%, indicating that some 5% to 7% of previously reported tuition was being included as revenue for a second time. This year's procedure eliminates this. Furthermore, the endowment ratio moved up from 22% to 24%; and,

correspondingly the gifts/grants category increased from 40% to 45%. The double reporting phenomenon appears to have been largely confined to accredited institutions, since the other category of schools experienced only a drop of 1% (28%, down from 29% the previous year) in the tuition source of revenue. In contrast these newer reporting instructions appear to have no impact on the expenditure ratios, since these remained much the same last year as in the previous years.

The denominational revenue tables also present some interesting contrasts when compared with earlier years. Here the percentages of revenue derived from tuition also demonstrated some substantial changes in several of the United States denominational groups of schools. Readers will want to compare Table CC-1 in this and last year's edition. For example, the United Methodist tuition ratio dropped from 35% to 23%. However, the endowment ratio rose from 19% to 23%, as did the gifts/grants category from 37% to 45%. The 12% decrease is precisely offset by these increases. These changes are clearly the result of the new treatment of student aid. It now appears as income designated by source (endowment, gifts, grants, etc.), and those funds are not reported (by most schools) a second time as tuition income. Fiscally nothing has changed, except the mechanisms for reporting. By way of contrast the Canadian groups (United Church and Roman Catholic) show very little change, obviously a product of the fact that student aid is exceedingly modest in amount. The United States group exhibiting the least impact is the Southern Baptist schools, for the same reason.

One final observation and explanation is necessary. The discerning reader will detect a substantial increase in "educational and general revenue" when this Fact Book is compared with earlier editions. One must not be misled by this increase, since it is more apparent than real. Previously the Association segregated

student aid outside the educational and general category, both on the revenue and expenditure side. This has been eliminated, but only as an item of revenue. Hence revenue designated as student aid now appears within educational and general. It continues to be excluded from that category of expenditure, an arbitrary decision of the Association related to its procedures for assessing dues. Hence, if one wants to understand the full financial picture of a seminary, total revenues must be compared with total expenditures. One can no longer draw conclusions regarding fiscal health merely by examining educational and general revenue and expenditures.

Full details on all of these matters are available in the appendices, Tables AA-1 through JJ-2. As noted they must be read with care when compared with the same tables in previous Fact Books.
