The Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada (ATS) is recognized by the United States Department of Education and the Commission on Recognition of Postsecondary Accreditation for the accreditation of graduate professional theological schools. The Association began in 1918 as a conference of theological schools that met biennially. In 1936, it became an association, adopted standards for judging quality, and in 1938 established a list of accredited schools. During the 1995-96 academic year ATS comprised 224 Protestant, Roman Catholic, and Orthodox theological schools, reflecting a broad spectrum of denominational, ecclesiastical, and theological perspectives in North America.

The purpose of the Association is the improvement of theological education. It seeks to achieve that purpose through accreditation and program services for its member schools. Some of these services include fellowships and informational resources for faculty research and development; leadership development seminars for presidents, deans, and trustees; data collection and information services; publications including the biennial *Bulletin*, bi-monthly newsletter *Colloquy*, journal *Theological Education*; and numerous conferences and seminars for theological school personnel.

# INTRODUCTION

The Fact Book on Theological Education has been published annually by The Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada since 1969. This edition is based on data supplied by member institutions in the fall of 1995 as required by their ATS membership or accreditation status. The Fact Book is published as a service to member schools for purposes of comparison and institutional planning and for general public information about theological schools in the United States and Canada. All ATS member schools conduct post-baccalaureate programs of theological education leading to master's or doctoral level degrees for ministerial/priestly leadership or academic study of the various theological disciplines.

The data in the 1995-96 Fact Book for enrollment, personnel, and compensation, unless otherwise designated, reflect the status of the schools in fall 1995. The financial data reflected in institutional income, expenditures, and development efforts are derived from schools' most recently completed fiscal year, which for most schools was the academic year 1994-95. The time frame reflected by the data reported in a table or narrative are clearly identified in the context of the description.

During the past three years, ATS has been engaged in a major project to redevelop its data collection and analysis capabilities. This project follows a late-1980s effort to revise the kind of data that ATS collects and the ways in which those data are displayed in the *Fact Book*. The current project is further revising the kind of data collected and the amount of information published in the *Fact Book*. ATS data capabilities now make it possible to compute an institutional peer profile for each school that contains comparative information for that institution in the context of a group of its peer schools. Because the peer profiles provide information for focused patterns of analysis, some *Fact Book* tables which had provided less helpful generalized comparisons have been deleted.

To provide for ease of reading, tables and figures have been numbered sequentially in the 1995-96 Fact Book. To provide continuity with the 1994-95 edition, an index of comparable 1994-95 and 1995-96 tables and figures is presented on page 125. Next year's edition of the Fact Book will be different from this year's in several ways, and similar indexes will be prepared to assure ease of access to year-by-year comparisons.

The ATS Fact Book reflects a variety of decision rules about the classification of institutions, the computation of full-time equivalent enrollment, classification of degree programs, and use of racial/ethnic categories. The information on the following pages summarizes definition and classification categories used throughout the Fact Book.

# Full-time Equivalency Computation

Information on enrollment is reported according to head count (the total number of students enrolled) and full-time equivalency (FTE). The latter is calculated by ATS in the following two ways:

For all doctoral programs the FTE equals the Head Count (HC).

For all master-level programs FTE is computed in the following manner:

Divide the total number of credits required for the degree by the number of semesters or quarters prescribed for degree duration to determine the average academic load. The total of credit hours taken by all students in a given degree program in a semester or quarter is divided by the average academic load. For Example: An M.Div. degree requires 90 semester hours, and the school considers the degree to be typically six semesters. The average academic load would be 90 divided by 6, or 15 hours per semester. If all M.Div. students complete a total of 600 hours for the semester, and the average academic load is 15, then the FTE would be 600 divided by 15, or 40 students.

# Racial/Ethnic Categories

ATS uses the racial/ethnic categories as defined by IPEDS. The definitions are as follows:

Non-resident alien: A person who is not a citizen or national of the United States or Canada and who is in the country on a visa or temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely.

Black, non-Hispanic: A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa (except those of Hispanic origin).

American Indian or Alaskan Native: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America who maintains cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community recognition.

Asian or Pacific Islander: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, the Indian Subcontinent, or Pacific Islands. This includes people from China, Japan, Korea, the Philippine Islands, American Samoa, India, and Vietnam.

Hispanic: A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

White, non-Hispanic: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa, or the Middle East (except those of Hispanic origin).

Race/Ethnicity Unknown or Unavailable: A person whose race or ethnic identity is either unknown or information about that person is unavailable.

# Comparing Data Over Time

The methods by which the data have been computed have changed in some cases over those in previous *Fact Books*. The number of member institutions has changed every even-numbered year since 1988, and some degree programs have been reclassified. All these changes make over-time comparisons with earlier editions potentially less meaningful. A number of tables in the 1995-96 *Fact Book* report data over a three- to five-year period, and these tables have accounted for these variables. Comparisons over time within these tables are altogether appropriate.

# CHAPTER 1 INSTITUTIONAL CHARACTERISTICS

# **HIGHLIGHTS**

- In 1995-96, the typical ATS institution has an enrollment of 188 students, 10 full-time faculty members, a library with slightly over 110,000 volumes, an endowment of \$4.5 million, an annual operating budget of \$2.5 million, and M.Div. tuition of \$5,655 per year.
- More than half of all students at ATS member schools attend one of 35 institutions with enrollments larger than 500 students.

ATS maintains three membership categories: accredited, candidate for accreditation, and associate. The figures in this table reflect the membership status current at the end of each calendar year. Descriptions of each category and the criteria for membership are listed in *Bulletin 41*, Part 1, Constitution and Dues Structure, Article IV, and *Bulletin 41*, Part 3, Procedures, Standards, and Criteria for Membership.

The following schools were admitted into their respective categories in the last calendar year.

Accredited: Payne Theological Seminary, S.S. Cyril & Methodius Seminary

Candidate for Accreditation: Baptist Theological Seminary at Richmond, Capital Bible Seminary, Harding University Graduate School of Religion, Westminster Theological Seminary in California

Two ATS accredited institutions closed in 1995: Maryknoll School of Theology and St. Thomas Theological Seminary.

Table 1.2, Significant Institutional Characteristics of Each Member School 1995-96, follows and contains the most recent data on selected institutional characteristics of each member school. The symbol "nr" indicates that the school did not report data in that category. The column headings in the table are defined below.

Status—The Association maintains three classes of membership: accredited (Accred.), candidate for accrediation (Cand.), and associate (Assoc.). Criteria for membership are listed in *Bulletin 41*, Part 3, Procedures, Standards, and Criteria for Membership. Status is reported as of the end of 1995.

U/I — University/College Affiliated or Independent/Freestanding. University affiliation is defined as schools of theology that are integral parts of larger institutions that possess at least two other professional schools or departments at the graduate level. Schools in this category usually possess a broader range of resources than is available at Independent schools. The distinction, however, is not absolute. Some Independent schools have relationships with colleges or universities that provide access to similar resources.

Race — Each school identifies the predominant racial/ethnic identity of its enrolled students. For descriptions of categories, see the Introduction.

Prov(ince)/St(ate) — The geographical location of each school is identified using postal code abbreviations.

Church/Denom(ination) — Each school identifies its religious affiliation when it applies for membership. An explanation of the codes is found in Appendix 1. Even though some schools are formally related to more than one denomination, only one denomination is listed in this table. The ATS *Bulletin 41*, Part 4, Directory, lists all denominations for schools with more than one denominational affiliation.

Expenditures — These data are expenditures for fiscal year 1994-95. Canadian school data are reported in Canadian dollars; United States schools are reported in United States dollars.

**E&G** — The figures reported as Total Educational and General Expenditures include: instruction and net academic support, research, public service, library, student services, admissions, institutional support, operation and maintenance of plant, mandatory transfers and debt repayments, and scholarships and fellowships.

Total — Total Expenditures include E&G and expenditures classified as Auxiliary/Ancillary Enterprises which, in most ATS schools, typically include such items as student housing, meal service, and book store.

**Endowment** — Most schools report the market value of endowment assets as of the end of fiscal year 1994-95. A few schools report book value instead. Canadian schools report in Canadian dollars. United States schools report in United States dollars.

Faculty — The data on faculty is for fall 1995.

F.T. — Individuals receiving a full salary and who devote more than 50% of their time to teaching.

**F.T.E.** — The full-time equivalency for faculty is derived by adding the number of full-time faculty and the equivalent of full-time teaching provided by part-time faculty. This latter figure is computed by dividing the total number of courses taught by all part-time faculty by the average teaching load of full-time faculty.

Library Vol(ume)s — The total number of printed books, serials, and periodicals as of fall 1995. Library data reflect various library arrangements among member schools, and these are extensively footnoted in the table.

**Enrollment** — The data report enrollment as of fall 1995.

H.C. — Head count enrollment is the total number of students enrolled.

F.T.E. — Computation of full-time equivalent enrollment varies by degree program and is described on page xi.

Based on the variables in this table, the typical (i.e., median) ATS institution had a head count enrollment of 188 students with 10 full-time faculty members. Part-time and adjunct faculty contributed the equivalent of another 3.8 full-time positions to the typical school. The median institution could draw on a library with more than 111,000 volumes, possessed an endowment of \$4.5 million, and had an annual operating budget of \$2.5 million. The median tuition for the Master of Divinity program was \$5.655 for 1995-96.

University Affiliated: This designation identifies those schools of theology that are integral parts of larger institutions that possess at least two other professional schools or departments at the graduate level. Schools in this category usually possess a broader range of resources than is available at Independent schools. The distinction, however, is not absolute. Some Independent schools have other types of relationships with colleges or universities that provide access to similar resources.

Primary racial/ethnic composition: Each school identifies the primary racial/ethnic composition of its student body.

- Roman Catholic: Diocesan, university departments of theology, and religious order (including union) seminaries in the United States and Canada.
- Orthodox: Greek Orthodox and Orthodox Church in America.

The distribution of schools by size remains relatively stable over 10 years, although more are larger in 1995 than in 1985. In 1985 44.3% of schools had a head count enrollment of 150 students or less; in 1995 the percentage had dropped to 39.0%. Likewise in 1985, 58.8% of schools had a full-time equivalent enrollment of 150 or less; in 1995 this percentage had dropped to 52.2%. The average head count enrollment at an ATS member school in 1995 was 299, the median 188. The average full-time equivalent enrollment at an ATS institution was 217 while the median was 139. Two ATS member schools terminated their programs in 1995. More detailed information on head count and full-time equivalent enrollment may be found in Chapter 2.




Figure 1.1 illustrates the distribution of students at ATS schools by institutional size. While the median head count enrollment at an ATS school is 188, slightly more than 50% of students attend the 35 institutions with enrollments larger than 50% students.

# CHAPTER 2 ENROLLMENT

# HIGHLIGHTS

- Applications to degree programs at ATS member schools remained stable or declined in 1995 but total enrollment at ATS member schools has continued to climb. Since 1991, enrollment in all degree programs has grown by 9.6%
- The number of students enrolled in M.Div. programs at Protestant denominational and inter/nondenominational institutions increased by 9% over the past five years, while at Roman Catholic institutions, M.Div. enrollment has declined by 12%.
- The number of racial/ethnic minority students at ATS schools continues to grow, increasing from 15.2% in 1991 to 18.3% in 1995.
- Older students (35 and over) constitute 57.7% of all students at ATS member schools.
- The number of women enrolled in M.Div. programs has increased by 17.5% since 1991.

Between 1994 and 1995, overall applications to approved degree programs at all member schools dropped by about 2%, but the number of enrollees did not decrease correspondingly. The number of new M.Div. enrollees rose in the early 1990s to a high of 8,369 in 1992. The number of 1995 enrollees remains 11% higher than the number of enrollees in 1989 and 7% higher than the number of enrollees in 1990.

Acceptance rates to M.Div., Professional Masters, Academic Masters, and D.Min. programs all ranged from 77.3% to 81.1%. The Advanced Research programs (Th.D., Ph.D., S.T.D., S.T.M., and Th.M.) remained the most selective and less than half of the applications to these programs were accepted. The figures represent combined acceptance rates at all ATS schools; acceptance rates at individual schools may vary significantly from these figures.

Tables 2.2 through 2.7 report the fall head count and full-time equivalent enrollments at all member schools over a five-year period. Tables 2.4-2.7 group enrollment data across these same years by church/denominational affiliation. The tables also indicate the percentage of increase or decrease in enrollment from the previous year. The generally larger increases in enrollment during even-numbered years is partially the result of new schools becoming members of the Association in the year of the Biennial Meeting. Other Doctorates refers to the D. Miss., Ed.D., S.M.D./D.M.A./D.C.M. degree programs. The kinds of degrees included in other categories are summarized on page x. For the Doctor of Ministry program the full-time equivalent enrollment equals the head count enrollment, even though the degree must be completed part-time over a period of at least three years.

Between 1994 and 1995, head count enrollment figures at all member schools increased by 1.5% although the full-time equivalent grew only negligibly. Since 1991, the head count enrollment in all programs has grown by 9.3%, the full-time equivalent by 10.1%. Much of this gain has come in programs other than the M.Div. degree category which has increased by a full-time equivalent of only 3.1% since 1991. While Protestant denominational schools and schools with multiple or no denominational affiliation have continued to see increases in M.Div. enrollment over the past five years, full-time equivalent enrollment at Roman Catholic schools in the M.Div. program has dropped by 13% since 1991. Overall enrollment at Roman Catholic institutions, however, has not dropped significantly.

Tables 2.2 and 2.3 report fall head count and full-time equivalent enrollment, respectively, in all member schools, and the percentage increase or decrease in enrollment from the previous year.

Comparing head count enrollment for the same 204 schools with the head count at all member schools indicates that much of the increase in total head count enrollment over the past five years is due to an increase in enrollment at existing member schools rather than a function of the enrollment of new schools granted ATS membership. Total head count enrollment in all schools increased 6173 from fall 1991 to fall 1995. Of this number, 4251 represented growth in the 204 schools that were members of the Association for all five years, and 1922 students comprised the enrollment growth attributable to new schools being admitted to the Association.




Figure 2.1 represents the head count enrollment by degree category over five years. The total growth is not a function of any one degree program. The professional and academic master's programs have seen the largest proportional gains in this five-year period, growing 20.0% and 18.1% respectively. Enrollment increases in the M.Div. programs have been more modest, totaling 6.5% over five years.




Figure 2.4 illustrates the full-time enrollment by degree category over five years. With the exception of Other Professional Doctorates, enrollment calculated by full-time equivalent has increased in all program categories. Most notably the full-time equivalent enrollment in academic master's programs has increased 27.7% since 1991. Head count enrollment in the same program increased 18.1% indicating that a greater percentage of students seeking academic master's degrees are attending full-time in 1995 than in 1991. Full-time equivalent enrollment in professional master's programs increased significantly (10.1%) in this period but less than the increase in head count enrollment (20.0%) indicating that a greater percentage of these students are enrolled part-time in 1995 than were enrolled in 1991. Full-time equivalent enrollment increased most dramatically in non-degree programs (74.7%), but the significance of this increase is mitigated by the high percentage of part-time students in this category. FTE and head count enrollments for the D.Min. program are identical because the program is by definition part-time.

#### HEAD COUNT ENROLLMENT IN ALL PROGRAMS BY RACE




Figure 2.3 shows the head count enrollment in all programs by race. The number of minority students enrolled at ATS schools increased over the five-year period from 1991 to 1995. The number of Asian students rose by 60.5%. In the same period, Black enrollees increased by 24.2%. Hispanic enrollment grew by 14.8%, and international (non-resident alien) students grew by 22.3%. While minority students enrolled at ATS institutions increased, White enrollment stagnated over the five-year period and decreased marginally by 0.2%. The percentage of students who are White declined from 76.8% in 1991 to 69.5% in 1995. Native American enrollment also grew (28.9%) in this period but their overall numbers (0.3% of total enrollment) are too small to be reflected in the figure above.

#### HEAD COUNT ENROLLMENT IN M.DIV. PROGRAMS BY RACE




Figure 2.4 represents the head count enrollment in M.Div. degree programs by race. The number of minority students enrolled in M.Div. programs increased substantially, but not as quickly as in other programs. Asian enrollment rose 42.6%, Black enrollment by 20.2%. The number of Hispanic students in M.Div. programs increased by 5.6%; the number of international (non-resident alien) students in M.Div. programs increased by 7.4%. White enrollment in M.Div. programs grew only marginally by 1.3%. Native American enrollment in M.Div. programs also increased (15.3%) but their numbers are too small to be reflected in the figure above.

## HEAD COUNT ENROLLMENT IN ALL PROGRAMS BY GENDER




Figure 2.5 illustrates the total number of men and women students enrolled in all degree programs. While the numbers of men enrolled have increased 6.3% since 1991, the number of women enrollees has grown at a faster rate (19.5%) in the same period. Overall, women now constitute 32.9% of all enrollment, up from 30.4% in 1991.





Figure 2.6 represents the total number of men and women students enrolled in M.Div. programs and illustrates that much of the growth in the M.Div. has come from an increase in female students. The number of women enrolled in M.Div. programs has increased 17.5% since 1991 while the number of men enrolled grew by only 2.8% in the same period. Overall, women make up 27.5% of M.Div. enrollment in 1995, up from 25.0% in 1991.

#### HEAD COUNT ENROLLMENT IN M.DIV. PROGRAMS BY AGE AND GENDER






Figure 2.7 represents head count enrollment in all programs at ATS schools by age category and gender, while Figure 2.8 represents enrollment in M.Div. programs only. Students 35 and older constitute well over half (57.7%) of all enrollees in ATS schools, although the number of older students in M.Div. programs is less pronounced: enrollees 35 and older make up 44.9% of M.Div. enrollees. Women are more likely to be older than men in the M.Div. and other degree programs. 61.6% of women enrolled in M.Div. programs are over 34 whereas 38.6% of men enrolled in M.Div. programs are over 34. In all degree programs, 65.4% of women are 35 and older, while 53.9% of men are.

In the fall of each year the schools report the number of students who completed a degree or other program during the previous academic year. This table reports the number of completions and the percentage increase or decrease from the previous year. Some perspective on completion rates can be gained by comparing the number of completions to the new enrollees four years previously. (A four-year figure is used because M.Div. programs at Lutheran and Roman Catholic schools are by definition four-year programs.) Over the past years, the number of completions have not grown as quickly as the number of new enrollees at ATS schools. From 1989 to 1991 the number of enrollees in M.Div. programs increased by 6.7%. In the corresponding period of 1993-1995 four years later, the number of M.Div. completions grew by only 3.9%. In 1995, M.Div. completions constituted 84.1% of the 1991 new enrollees in M.Div. degree programs.

# CHAPTER 3 COMPOSITION OF FACULTY AND COMPENSATION OF PERSONNEL

#### HIGHLIGHTS

- The number of minority faculty members at ATS institutions has grown by 26.9% since 1991. Racial/ethnic minorities now constitute 10.2% of all ATS faculty members, up from 8.4% in 1991.
- The number of women faculty members grew by 40.3% from 1991 to 1995. Women now hold 21.2% of faculty positions at ATS member institutions.
- Over the past two years, the average compensation at U.S. accredited institutions grew by 7.1% for faculty at all ranks. Average administrative compensation grew by 6.6%. During this period the Consumer Price Index increased by 5.2%.



As a percentage of total faculty members, the growth in minority faculty has been slow but consistent. In 1991 8.4 % of all ATS faculty were Asian, Black, Hispanic, or Native American; by 1995 that percentage had risen to 10.2%. The growth in absolute numbers is more dramatic. The number of minority faculty at ATS schools grew from 227 in 1991 to 288 in 1995, an increase of 26.9%. During that same period, the total number of all faculty members increased from 2706 to 2829. At the rank of Assistant Professor, the increase in minority representation is most pronounced. In 1991, 48 (9.6%) of Assistant Professors were Asian, Black, Hispanic, or Native American; by 1995 that number had risen to 83 (14.5%). Cf. Table 3.1.

#### MINORITY FACULTY AS A PERCENTAGE OF TOTAL FULL-TIME FACULTY AT ALL MEMBER SCHOOLS





Figure 3.2 reflects Asian, Black, Hispanic, and Native American faculty members as a percentage of all faculty members at ATS schools from 1991 to 1995. In this period, the number of Asian faculty members grew by 35.3% from 51 to 69: Hispanic faculty members grew by 45.6% from 46 to 67; and Black faculty members grew by 26.9% from 127 to 149. In the same period White faculty members increased by 2.0% from 2459 to 2507. The small percentage of Native American faculty remained unchanged.






Approximately 20% of minority faculty members hold positions in institutions that are predominately racial/ethnic minority schools. While the other 80% are members of faculties that are predominately White, more than 100 ATS schools reported no racial/ethnic minority faculty members.

The number of female faculty continued to grow at member schools from 1991 to 1995. In the five-year period, the total number of women at all ranks grew by 40.3% from 427 in 1991 to 599 in 1995. The total number of men dropped slightly from 2279 in 1991 to 2225 in 1995, a 2.3% reduction. As a percentage of all faculty members, women increased from 15.8% in 1991 to 21.2% in 1995. In 1995, the typical (i.e., median) ATS school had 20% of its full-time faculty positions occupied by women. 38 schools had no female full-time faculty at all, while 9 schools had 50% or more female faculty.

At lower ranks, the median salary and housing of ATS faculty compares well with faculty salaries in philosophy and religion departments of public and private four-year institutions. As rank increases, however, the disparity becomes more pronounced. The average salary of a professor of Religion/Philosophy at a public four-year institution is 18% higher than the average professorial salary and housing at an ATS institution; at private institutions the average is 9% higher. Differences at the rank of associate professor are smaller. The average salary of an associate professor at a public four-year institution is 6% greater than the equivalent average salary and housing at an ATS institution; at private institutions it is only 2% higher. At the rank of assistant professor, the ATS average salary is slightly higher than that of either four-year public or private institutions. While the average ATS salary and housing is generally less than that of departments of religion/philosophy, it is slightly higher in all categories than departments of theological studies and religious vocations at private four-year institutions.

Table 3.6 provides data on the averages of total compensation earned by administrators and full-time faculty in United Sates accredited schools during each academic year. Total compensation includes contract salary, contributed services, housing allowance (if any) or the rental value of housing provided, pension payments, medical and other insurance. In the United States the Consumer Price Index grew at a rate of 2.61% in 1993-94 and 2.85% in 1994-95. Over the two fiscal years, average compensation for faculty members at all ranks grew somewhat faster than the CPI increase of 5.52% increasing by 7.1%. Total compensation for faculty at the rank of professor grew at 6.7% over the two years, associate professor compensation increased 6.7%, and assistant professor compensation grew at a rate of 7.3%. Administrative salaries increased less consistently. Chief Executive Officers' compensation grew by 6.5% while Academic Vice Presidents' and Deans' compensation increased by 2.5%. Chief Development Officers' compensation grew by 4.0%, and Chief Financial Officers' compensation increased by 6.8%.

Table 3.7 provides data on the averages of total compensation earned by administrators and full-time faculty in Canadian accredited schools during each academic year. Total compensation includes contract salary, contributed services, housing allowance (if any) or the retail value of housing provided, pension payments, medical and other insurance. # CHAPTER 4 FINANCES

## HIGHLIGHTS

- From 1994-95 to 1995-96, the average tuition and fees at freestanding member schools rose by 6.2%.
- Tuition and fees constitute an increasing portion of revenues at all member schools, growing from 24.6% of all revenues in 1990-91 to 30.5% in 1994-95.
- Support from denominations or religious organizations continues to decline, decreasing from 16.9% of all revenues in 1990-91 to 13.2% in 1994-95.
- Since the 1991-92 academic year, expenditures at ATS schools have outpaced revenues.
   In 1994-95 expenditures exceeded revenues by 1.7%.
- In 1994-95, ATS schools had average revenues of \$19,454 per full-time equivalent student and average expenses of \$19,705 per full-time equivalent student.

Table 4.1 provides a guide to tuition and fees charged for the Master of Divinity, Doctor of Ministry, and Ph.D./Th.D. programs by the full-time equivalent enrollment size of the institution. With the exception of the D.Min. program, the smallest and largest of ATS institutions charge less on average for tuition and fees in the M.Div. and Ph.D./Th.D. programs than do institutions with full-time equivalent enrollments between 150 and 1000 students. Large increases or decreases within a category in average tuition between 1994-95 and 1995-96 reflect the movement of an institution from one category to another rather than any overall changes in tuition. Tuition and fees for all M.Div. programs may be found in Table 1.2. All figures are in U.S. dollars. Canadian dollars were converted at the rate of \$0.72 U.S. for 1994-95 and \$0.73 U.S. for 1995-96.

Table 4.2 represents the changes in tuition and fees from 1994-95 to 1995-96 at university-affiliated and freestanding member schools. In the M.Div. and Ph.D./Th.D. programs, the yearly tuition rose at independent institutions more quickly than at university-affiliated institutions. In all categories with the exception of university-affiliated Ph.D./Th.D. programs, the increases in tuition outpaced the 2.85% growth in the Consumer Price Index for 1994-95. Corrected for inflation, the average M.Div. tuition increased at independent member schools by 3.2% and by 0.9% at university-affiliated schools.

From 1991-92 to 1995-96, tuition and fees at reporting institutions increased 28.8%, while total revenues grew by only 5.0%. Not every school reported data in each category. Table 4.4 presents the revenue sources at member schools from fiscal year 1990-91 to fiscal year 1994-95 as a percentage of total revenues. In this five-year period, tuition and fees at member schools have increased from 24.6% of total revenues in 1990-91 to 30.5% of total revenues in 1994-95. Gifts and grants from religious organizations have declined from 16.9% in 1990-91 to 13.2% in 1994-95. This continues a 30-year decline in the proportions of funding provided to ATS member schools from denominations or religious organizations. The percentage of income derived from endowment and investment has also declined from 20.8% in 1990-91 to 17.4% in 1994-95. Funding from religious organizations and the value of contributed services constitute 25.2% of revenues at Roman Catholic schools. In comparison, their Protestant denominational counterparts received 18.6% of their funding from equivalent sources. Nondenominational and interdenominational schools are more dependent on tuition and individual gifts and grants as revenue sources than are Roman Catholic or Protestant denominational schools.

The distribution of expenditures has changed less in the five-year period at member institutions than have revenue sources. Instruction and net academic support declined slightly from 34.3% to 33.2% while scholarships and fellowships increased from 10.1% to 11.2%. Other categories changed only minimally.

# CHAPTER 5 DEVELOPMENT

## HIGHLIGHTS

- In 1994-95 giving to ATS member schools increased by 4.67% to \$365 million.
- Religious organizations continue to provide the largest single source of giving to the
  operations of ATS member schools, but this giving is declining. Religious organizations
  contributed 42.1% of all operational gifts and 7.0% of all capital gifts to ATS member
  schools in 1994-95.
